Know the facts. The COVID-19 vaccines:

- ✓ **protect you, your family, and people in your community** from getting COVID-19.
- ✓ can **cause mild side effects** like a sore arm, fever, headaches, or fatigue. These are signs the vaccine is working. Severe allergic reactions are very rare, and treatable.
- ✓ undergo **rigorous safety testing** before being introduced. They're also constantly monitored for side effects.
- ✓ **are free** to everyone, even if you don't have health insurance.
- ✗ **do not** change your DNA.
- ✗ **do not** contain fetal cells, animal products, or microchips.
- ✗ **do not** contain the COVID-19 virus. Vaccines teach your body how to create antibodies that protect you from COVID-19.
