



About the Chatham EDC Board of Directors

The Chatham County Economic Development Corporation is a 501(c)3 non-profit corporation led by a board of directors. The board operates in accordance with bylaws, which are rules and principles that define the organization's governing structure.

There are nine voting members and eight ex-officio members of the board. All members of the board are expected to conduct themselves ethically in accordance with a code of conduct and in avoidance of conflicts of interest.

Voting directors are appointed to four-year terms and can serve up to two terms. Of the nine voting directors, six are appointed by the EDC board and three are appointed by the Chatham County Board of Commissioners.

The ex-officio members do not have terms or voting rights, and are:

- Central Carolina Community College president
- Chatham County manager
- Chatham County Chamber of Commerce executive director
- Chatham County EDC president
- Chatham County Schools superintendent
- Town of Goldston mayor
- Town of Pittsboro mayor
- Town of Siler City mayor

The board of directors meets on the third Wednesday of each month at 8:30 a.m. Meetings generally last 1.5 hours. The board is led by officers, which are reviewed and appointed annually. The officers of the board are the president of the EDC, chair, vice chair and secretary/treasurer.

The board encourages members to serve on committees that help accomplish goals and support staff in a smaller group setting. Committees are also reviewed and appointed annually. Examples include a finance committee and a nominating committee, each charged with specific duties. Committee meetings are determined by the committee members.
